#### Use:

- \* Drip irrigation to save water and energy
- \* Low-flow sprinkler heads
- \* Rain barrels that capture and store rainwater Get barrels at: **bewaterwise.com** Check:
- \* Timers are adjusted according to weather
- \* Leaks if your water bill is unusually high

### Maintenance Tips The "Quiet Garden" Approach

\* ENCOURAGE BENEFICIALS for pest control such as lizards, ladybugs, birds, fungi, & bacteria. \* RAKED LEAVES placed in the garden and lightly watered down will compress, stay in place, decompose, and add nutrients to the soil.

\* USE HAND TOOLS such as clippers, brooms, and rakes to reduce energy use, dust, and noise. \* REMOVE OLD FLOWERS only when, if shaken upside down, no seed (bird food) falls out.

\* ORDER GREEN BINS from your local waste management service.
